2.7.1 Students' Feedback from SSS

1. Result of of Feedback on Academic Audit (2018-19)

The feedback was collected from 264 students about Academic audit which was analyzed, verified and found that in the session 2018-19.

- The official website was accessible to 75.25% of students and not accessible to 24.25%.
- It is found that 79.55% students were benefitted by academic counseling and 20.45% not benefitted.
- 84.45% of students were satisfied learning facility of the college.
- According to 77.27% student's teachers were able to complete the curriculum within the scheduled period and 22.73% of student of students expressed it negatively.
- According to 76.52% of students the centre and departmental library of the college were well equipped to cover the course content and 23.48% did not accept.
- 70.07% of students were benefitted by the tutorial and digital classes and 29.93% were not benefited.
- 74.25% of students were satisfied with the provision of two internal assessments conducted by the examination authority and 25.75% were not satisfied.
- According to 80.68% students, teachers suggested study materials and the answer of 19.32% were negative.
- 79.17% students expressed that seminars/group Discussion was organized in the college and the response of 20.83% was negative.
- According to 75.37% of students they were benefitted by the extension activities/career counseling organized by IQAC in the college and 24.63% expressed it negatively.

2. Result of Students' Feedback On Curriculum 2018-19

Student's feedback on curriculum was collected from 240 students for the session 2018-19 and verified by the committee. It is found that

- when the question regarding the curriculum whether it was sufficient to give adequate knowledge asked, 42.50% students strongly agreed, 50.00% agreed, 6.67% did not agree and 0.83% did not respond.
- Were the prescribed textbook/reference books are sufficient for understanding of the subject on that question they responded as follows: 41.25% strongly agree, 45.21% agree, 9.17 do not agree and 4.17% no response was recorded.
- When they were asked whether the curriculum provides scope in terms of subject choice, they responded as follows: 35.42% strongly agreed, 38.75% agreed, 16.67% did not agree and 9.16% did not respond.
- Regarding the question whether the curriculum was relevant according to the present day situation, students' response is as follows: 38.33% strongly agreed, 42.08% agreed 16.67% did not agree and 2.92% did respond.
- When students were asked that whether the curriculum provides scope for present day employment their responses were as follows: 40.00% strongly agreed, 43.75% agreed, 12.08% did not agree and 4.17% did respond.
- When students were asked whether curriculum helps to pursue higher studies they responded as follows 36.25% strongly agreed, 42.92% agreed, 14.58% did not agree and 6.25% did not respond.

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
